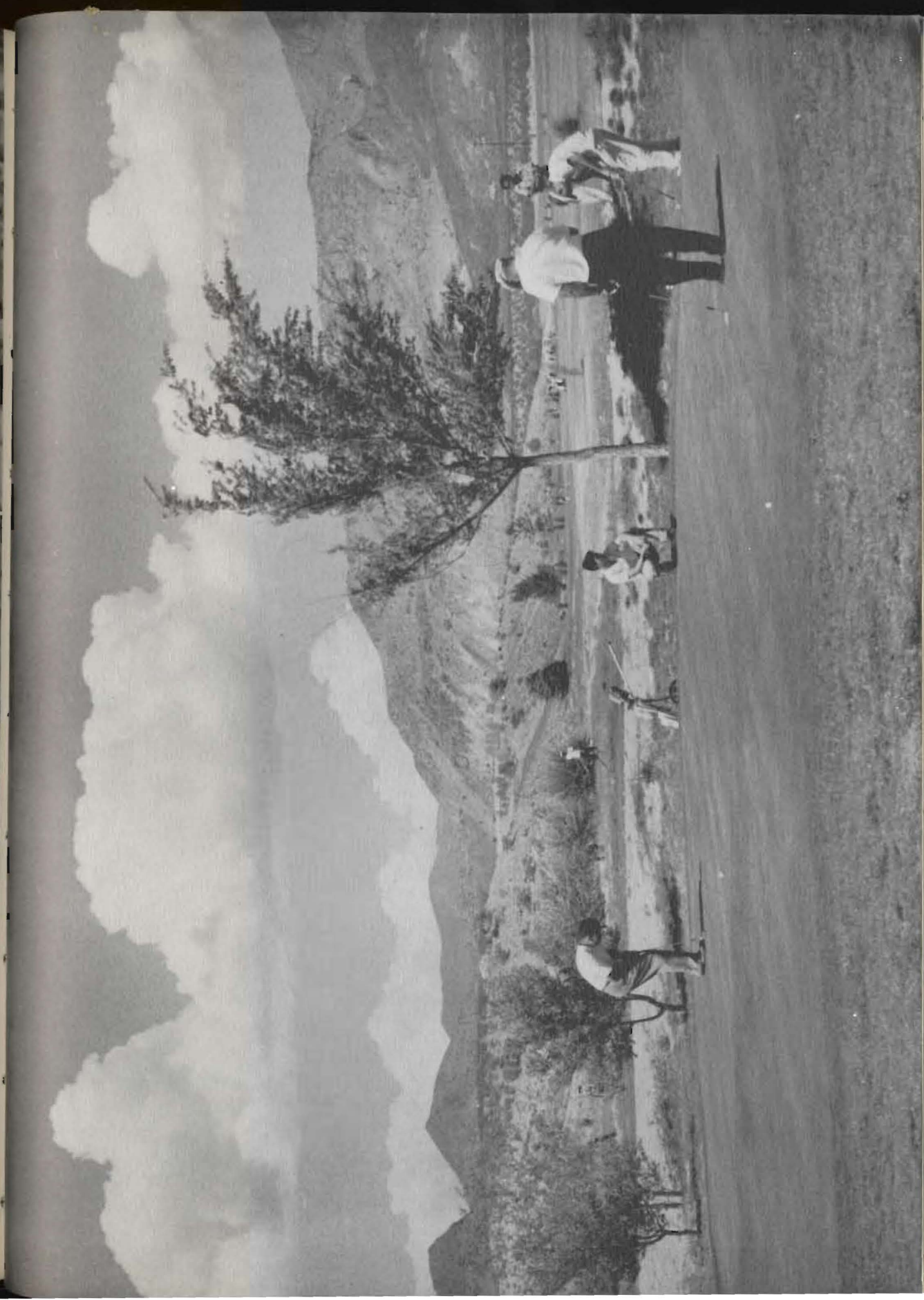












WELLS OF CONFIDENCE

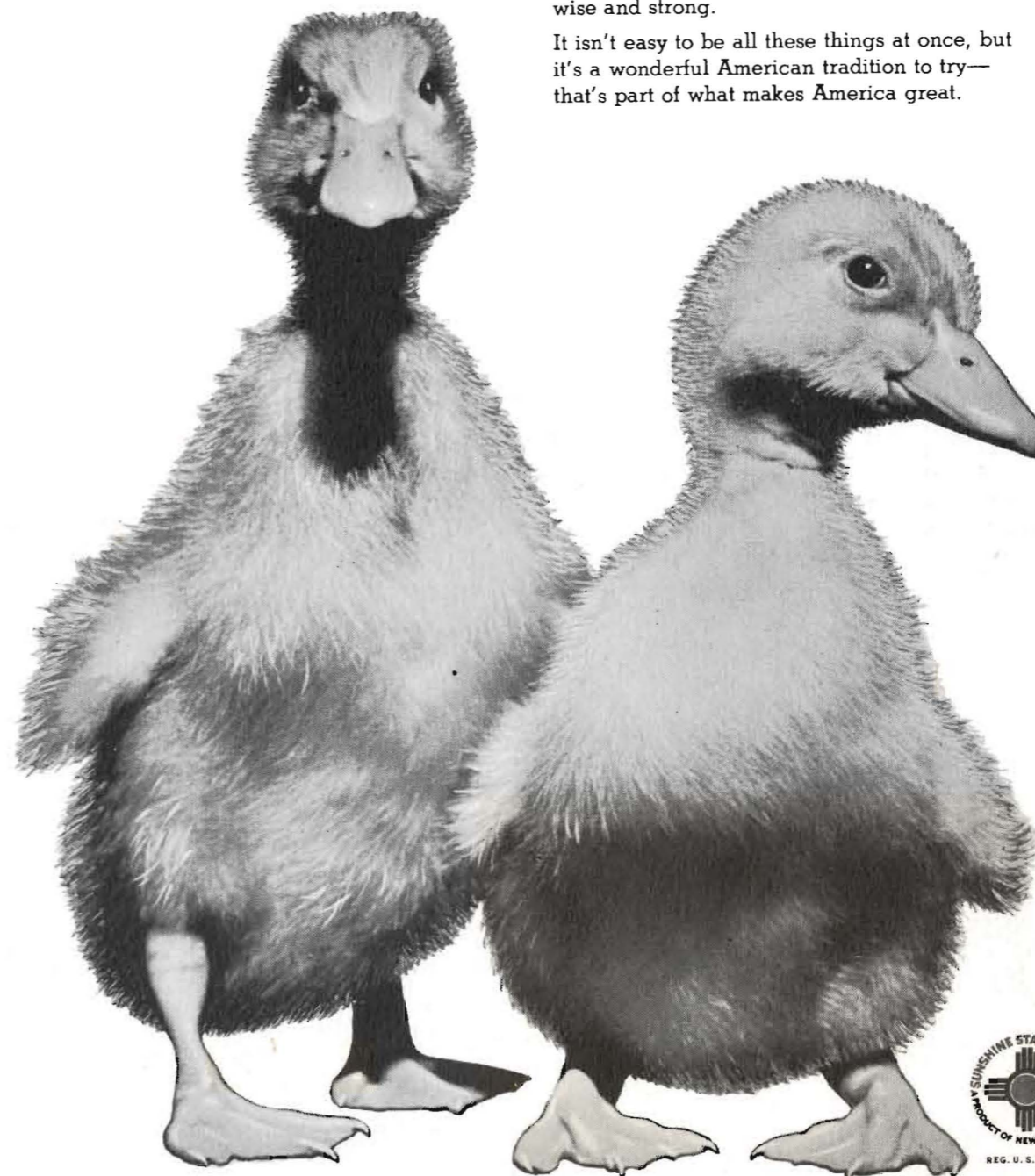
REMEMBER WHEN YOU WERE A FRESHMAN?

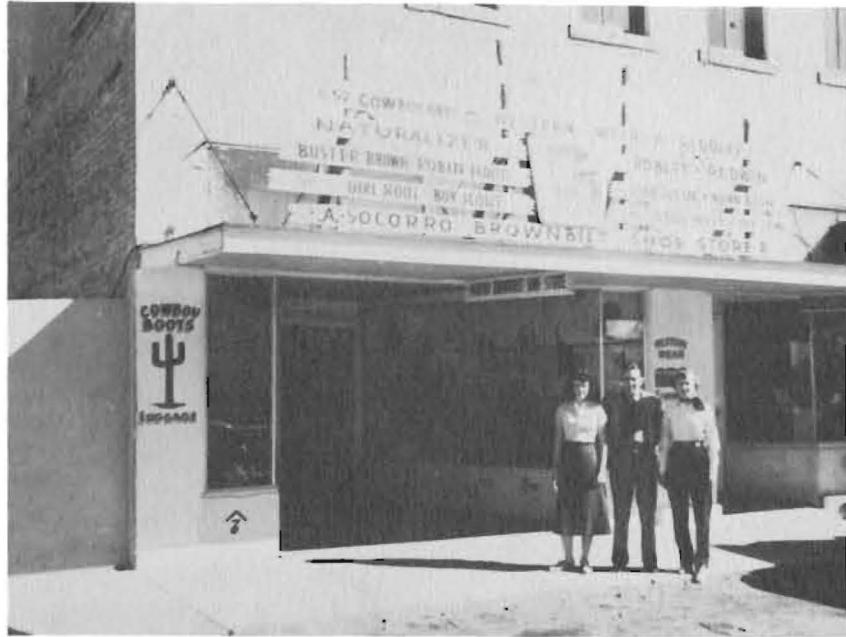

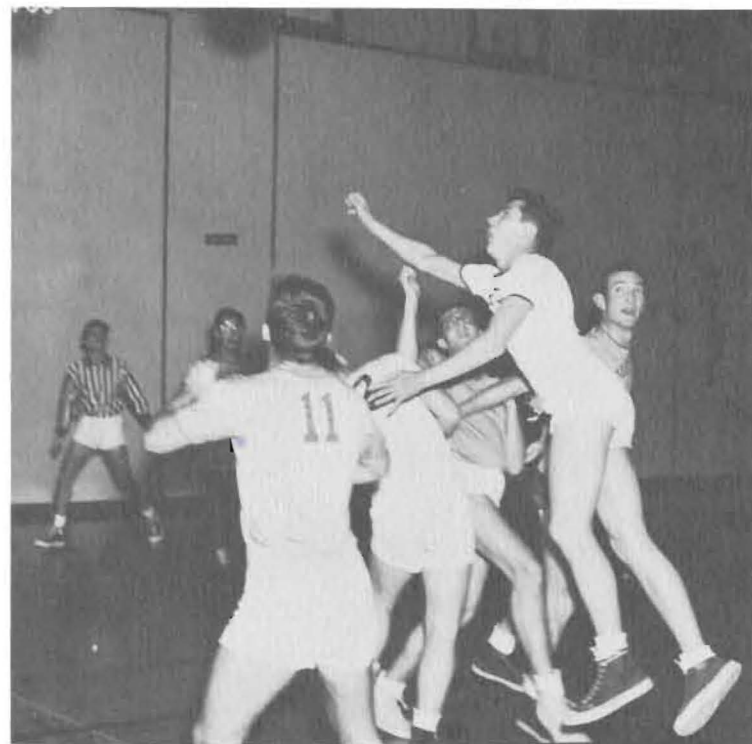
